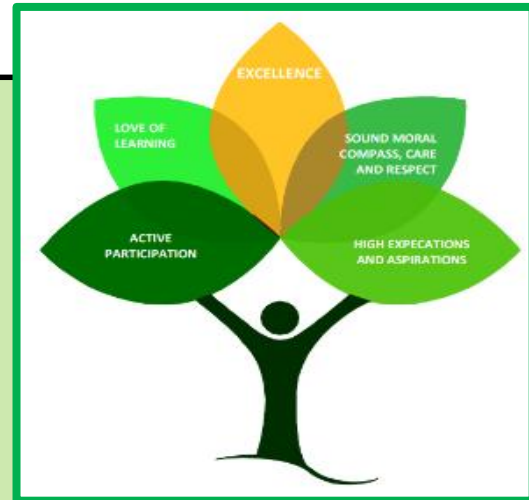




EMMA WATSON SPEAKS TO THE U.N.

Timeline for Equality for Women in the UK



1867

The London Society for Women's Suffrage is formed to campaign for female suffrage (the right to vote.)



1903

Emmeline Pankhurst founds the Women's Social and Political Union (WSPU) and campaigns for suffrage.



1919

Nancy Astor becomes the first woman to take her seat in the House of Commons.



1948

The introduction of the National Health Service (NHS) gives everyone free access to health care. Previously, only the insured, usually men, benefited.



1970

Working women were refused mortgages in their own right as few women worked continuously.

1977

International Women's Day is formalised as an annual event by the United Nations.



International Women's Day

1994

Employment Rights Act guarantees every working woman the right to maternity leave for the first time.

2003

Gender pay gap still at 19%.

1870

The Married Women's Property Act allows married women to own their own property. Previously, when women married, their property transferred to their husbands.



1913

Emily Davison throws herself under the King's horse at the Epsom Derby and is killed protesting for women's rights.

1928

Women given the vote at the age of 21 - the same as men.



1968 Women at the Ford car factory in Dagenham strike over equal pay.



1975

The Equal Pay Act and Sex Discrimination Act come into effect to promote equal opportunities.

1979

Margaret Thatcher becomes Britain's first female prime minister.



1997

120 women win seats in the general election.
