

International Stress Awareness Day 6th November 2022

International Stress Awareness Week was created in 2018 to raise awareness about stress prevention, following the establishment of Stress Awareness Day in 1998.

International Stress Awareness Week has developed as a major annual event focusing on stress management. Subjects this year's event will address is "Working Together to Build Resilience and Reduce Stress", and ISMA members in the UK and internationally will be engaging in dialogue with businesses and individuals in their local areas, as well as delivering online or offline workshops and presentations, so that our key messages about raising awareness and reducing the stigma around stress and mental health can be heard locally, regionally and globally.



Literacy for Learning at Light Hall

Here at Light Hall, we recognise the importance of literacy and reading and place it firmly at the heart of what we do. Literacy is the ability to **read**, **write**, **speak and listen** in a way that lets us communicate effectively and make sense of the world. As such, language and literacy are important for our **personal**, **social**, **cultural and economic development**. Not only that, literacy is fundamental to all areas of learning, as it **unlocks access to the wider curriculum**.

Recently, we had our first Sharing Stories activity where we joined the National Literacy Trust's **Take 10 at 10** campaign and all Key Stage 3 children read along with a member of staff for ten minutes. Our year 7 and 8 forms have also been taking part in weekly '**Wondrous Words**' competitions every week as part of their form time Literacy activities. Mr Brookes has been very pleased and impressed by the entries and would like to thank everyone

for taking part, in particular the following forms for their winning entries!

For the longest palindrome (wc 20 Sep): racecar (7DHSN, 8EMDU, 8DDSC and 8AMRO), rotator (7ASHA)

For the longest alphabetised word (wc 26 Sep): accept (8EMDU), access (7DHSN) and bellow (7EJBA)

For the longest refractory rhyme (word with no perfect rhyme - wc 03 Oct): cinnamon (7CGWE)

For the longest one syllable word being (wc 10 Oct): Strained (8AMRO), Squelched (8AJHO), Scrunched (7DHSN)

For the best pangram (sentence which uses all the letters of the alphabet - wc 17 Oct):

The fox jumps over the lazy dog and he is quick and brown (8EMDu – a special mention to O Pennant in 8EMDU for this!)



Finally, we have also recently held our inaugural Literacy Information Evening for the parents of all those students who are receiving some literacy and reading support during form times. Again, a massive thank you and well done from Mr Brookes, Mrs Tolley, Mrs Starkey and Miss Klejdysz for the students' hard work this past half term.



For all the parents of those students who are working hard with our Literacy and Reading programmes, Lexia and Bedrock, you will also find that there is an

announcement sent out via ClassCharts, along with the latest literacy activity pack from Bedrock which contains targeted activities for Autumn and half term, covering holidays such as Halloween, Diwali, Bonfire Night and the Day of the Dead.
