WHY STUDY RELIGIOUS STUDIES AT A-LEVEL?

Religious studies A-Level will ensure students gain a thorough understanding of the diverse philosophical and ethical views within contemporary society. Religious studies is a thought provoking subject and our contemporary themes will help you engage in intriguing classroom discussions. Students will explore philosophical issues such as the nature and existence of God, the problem of evil, life after death, the role of religion in society and the challenges to religion from science and from secularism. We will also explore a range of ethical theories, and apply them to crucial ethical issues such as medical ethics, sexual ethics, abortion, euthanasia, capital punishment and animal rights.

The course allows students to explore Islam in depth, looking at the diversity of views within Islam and focus particularly on areas such as authority, morality and the nature of faith. What is the authority of the Qur'an? Does God command what is good or is goodness what is commanded by God? What are the Muslim views on contemporary moral issues in society today?

All that is required is an open, enquiring mind and a willingness to engage fully with the issues.
