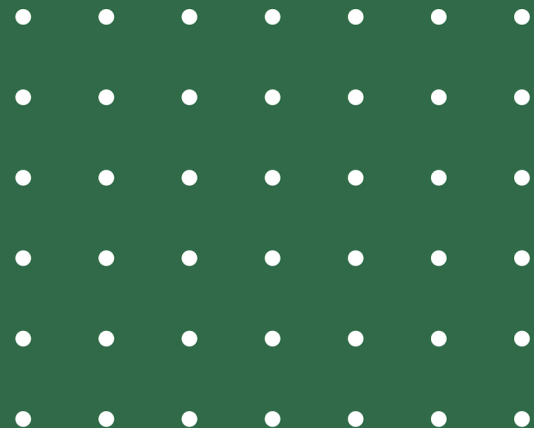
This year, Thank You Day is back with a twist – focusing on giving thanks to our local communities.



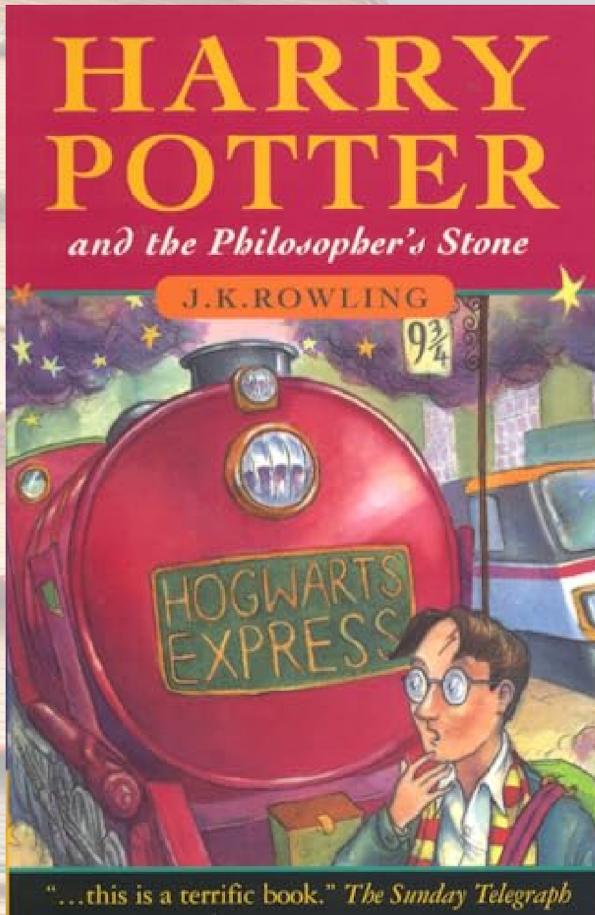
Members of the public

RECOMMENDED READS FOR THIS WEEK

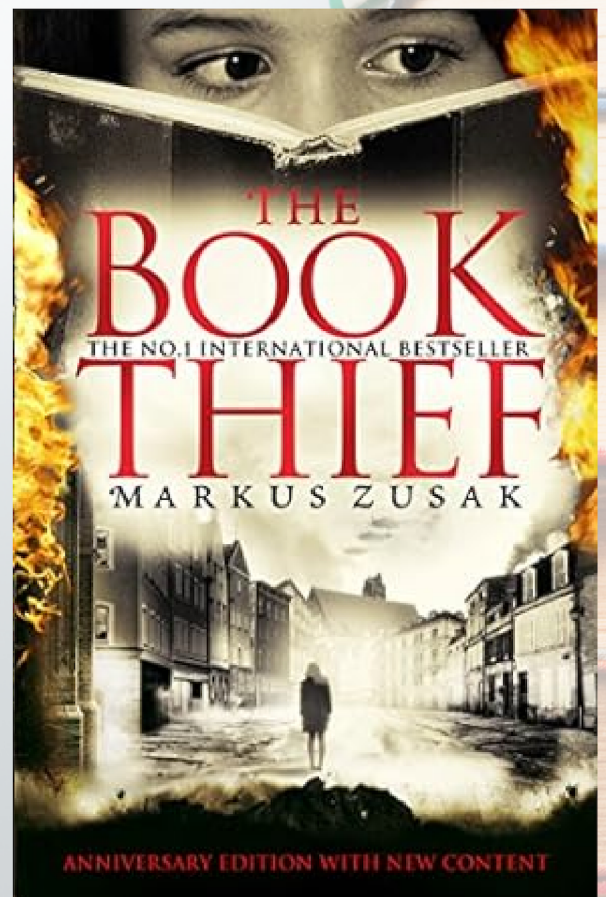
