Join Paddy McGuinness for his Ultra Endurance Cycle Challenge






RECOMMENDED READS



'Booked' by Kwame Alexander In this follow-up to the Newbery-winning novel THE CROSSOVER, soccer, family, love, and friendship, take centre stage as twelve-year-old Nick learns the power of words as he wrestles with problems at home, stands up to a bully, and tries to impress the girl of his dreams. Helping him along are his best friend and sometimes teammate Coby, and The Mac, a rapping librarian who gives Nick inspiring books to read. This electric and heartfelt novel-in-verse by poet Kwame Alexander bends and breaks as it captures all the thrills and setbacks, action and emotion of a World Cup match!

Five students walk into detention. Only four come out alive. Yale hopeful Bronwyn has never publicly broken a rule. Sports star Cooper only knows what he's doing in the baseball diamond. **Bad boy Nate is one misstep away** from a life of crime. **Prom queen Addy is holding together** the cracks in her perfect life.
